



CRUISETOUR 21: ARCTIC CIRCLE WILDLIFE & WILDERNESS

A 7-day Hubbard Glacier Discovery cruise, a 2-day adventure to the Arctic Ocean and Prudhoe Bay, and one night in Denali — for true adventurers.

Daily Itinerary

Day 1 Sail from Vancouver

Your five-star vessel boasts fewer passengers, larger staterooms and more space than any other in Alaska. Today you will notice this refined elegance as you sail under the Lion's Gate Bridge and enter the scenic wonders of the **Inside Passage**.

Day 2 Inside Passage scenic cruising

Steep coastal mountains and marine wildlife will be the backdrop to a relaxing day at sea. Whether with a massage in the Greenhouse Spa, a cooking lesson in the Culinary Arts Center or a game of chance in the casino, you'll discover exciting daily activities and elegant service.

Day 3 Ketchikan

Besides the main attractions — Creek Street, the Tongass Historical Museum, Totem Bight State Park and Saxman Village — there's one other thing we highly recommend you do. A flightseeing trip to breathtaking **Misty Fjords National Monument** is essential.

Day 4 Haines

This is the bald-eagle capital of Alaska. Tour the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve, walk the historic fort or take a high-speed catamaran to nearby Skagway to ride the White Pass & Yukon Route Railway. This frontier port is full of options.

Day 5 Juneau

Today, explore the lush Tongass National Forest or visit the rustic shops in town. History buffs can browse the Alaska State Museum. You'll have the day to explore **Mendenhall Glacier** or go whale watching, fishing or even dogsledding on a glacier!

Day 6 Sitka

In the shadow of volcanic Mt. Edgecumbe, Alaska's early Russian influence is still felt here. Stroll **Sitka National Historical Park** or get out on the water by kayak in search of seals, whales and eagles.

Day 7 Hubbard Glacier/Yakutat Bay scenic cruising

Today cruise to **Hubbard Glacier**, one of the premier attractions in Wrangell-St. Elias, the largest national park in North America and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Come face to face with a gigantic wall of ice that fills your view and extends for miles in either direction. Here you will have your best opportunity to experience calving as you listen to commentary from a Park Service Ranger. Watch from your ship as you pass some of Alaska's largest mountains including 18,008 ft. Mt. St. Elias.

Day 8 Seward/Anchorage

Enjoy the morning in lovely **Seward**, a picturesque fishing village on lovely Resurrection Bay. Meet your **Tour Director**, board your luxury motor coach and sightsee along the **Seward Highway**, a National Scenic Byway to **Anchorage**. Transfer to your hotel for a night's stay in Alaska's largest city.

Day 9 Anchorage/Prudhoe Bay

Have breakfast and transfer to the Anchorage International Airport. Fly across the **Arctic Circle** to the community of **Deadhorse** on **Prudhoe Bay**. You'll see the sights on an afternoon tour that takes in the oil fields and production wells that feed the **TransAlaska Pipeline**. Imagine life at this secluded outpost on the shores of the **Arctic Ocean**.

Day 10 Prudhoe Bay/Coldfoot

Today your **Dalton Highway** adventure begins. Your route skirts **Gates of the Arctic National Park** — four times the size of Yellowstone — and crosses over the scenic headland of the ancient **Brooks Range** at Atigun Pass on the Continental Divide. Watch for members of the famed Porcupine Caribou Herd as you travel to **Coldfoot**. This tiny outpost sits at the mouth of Slate Creek on the east bank of the Middle Fork of the Koyukuk River, population 13. Overnight in Coldfoot.

Day 11 Coldfoot/Fairbanks

After breakfast, the motor coach drive continues along the **Dalton Highway** and crosses the **Arctic Circle**. A photo stop at the famed Arctic Circle sign makes for a great souvenir of your trip. Then continue across the mighty **Yukon River** and take in the abundant wildlife. Arriving in **Fairbanks**, Alaska's "golden heart" city, you'll check into your downtown hotel.

Day 12 Fairbanks/Denali National Park

Board our **McKinley Explorer** luxury domed rail car and enjoy an optional breakfast onboard. Take in the sights of this, an Alaska Scenic Byway. This afternoon will find you exploring **Denali National Park**. Your **Tundra Wilderness Tour** travels deep into the park for great wildlife viewing — **caribou, moose, grizzly, wolves and Dall sheep** are frequently sighted — plus dramatic **Mt. McKinley** viewpoints.

Day 13 Denali/Anchorage

Wake up to a morning at leisure and reboard the **McKinley Explorer** for the continuation of your rail journey. Arrive in **Anchorage** where the city backs up to a stunning skyline of mountains. Say "good-bye" to your Tour Director.

Ketchikan: Neets Bay Bear Watch by Floatplane. Depart via floatplane to one of the finest bear viewing locations in Alaska. Hike ¼ mile down a well-maintained wilderness road to the viewing area where black bears fish. The secure, covered viewing area allows for up close observation.

Juneau: Alaska-Style Salmon Bake. Featuring Alaskan-caught wild salmon grilled over an open alderwood fire plus baked chicken, ribs, beans, wild-rice pilaf, salads, corn bread and lemonade, coffee or tea. Dine beside Salmon Creek in the rain forest and listen to a local musician over dinner.

Coldfoot: Scenic Koyukuk River Float. Enjoy a scenic float down the Middle Fork Koyukuk River through the Brooks Mountain Range. Relax as your raft floats through the vast wilderness of Alaska's Arctic and your guide shares the rich history of the region.
