CRUISETOUR 22: ARCTIC EXPEDITION FOR TRUE ADVENTURERS

One night in Denali, a 2-day adventure to the Arctic Ocean and Prudhoe Bay, 7-day Holland America Glacier Bay Discovery cruise — earn an Arctic Circle Club certificate.

Daily Itinerary

Day 1 Anchorage

Fly into Alaska's largest city to begin your Alaska adventure with your **Tour Director**. Check into your downtown hotel and spend the day at leisure.

Day 2 Anchorage/Denali National Park

Today you'll board our **McKinley Explorer**, the largest domed railcars on the historic Alaska Railroad route, an Alaska Scenic Byway. Sit back and relax in the observation lounge and watch magnificent scenery glide by. Upon arrival at **Denali National Park**, transfer to the finest lodge and spend your afternoon and evening at leisure. Optional adventures abound.

Day 3 Denali/Fairbanks

Depart your lodge for an early morning official **Tundra Wilderness Tour** (6-8 hours) of **Denali National Park**. Travel up to 53 miles of the Park Road for great wildlife viewing — **caribou, moose, grizzly, wolves** and **Dall sheep** are frequently sighted. Weather permitting, your vistas of **Mt. McKinley** will be unsurpassed. Later, reboard the **McKinley Explorer** and transfer to your downtown **Fairbanks** hotel.

Day 4 Fairbanks/Coldfoot

After breakfast, the motor coach travels the **Dalton Highway** with wildlife and wilderness spreading out for miles in every direction. After a photo stop at the **Arctic Circle**, you'll

continue on and likely see more wildlife in one day than most see in a lifetime — everything from marmot, squirrels and porcupine to huge, thousand-pound moose foraging at the edge of thickets where they can duck back into the brush if spooked. Arriving in Coldfoot, population 13, you'll feel a million miles from civilization.

Day 5 Coldfoot/Prudhoe Bay

The continuation of your journey along the North Slope Haul Road takes you past **Gates of the Arctic National Park** — four times the size of Yellowstone. After crossing over the Brooks Range at Atigun Pass, you'll descend onto the Arctic plain. Herds of caribou inhabit this area and are frequently seen with calves born in the spring. You'll overnight in Deadhorse, on the rugged, remote **North Slope of the Arctic** — a tiny outpost servicing Prudhoe Bay.

Day 6 Prudhoe Bay/Anchorage

The polar desert washed by the icy waters of the Arctic Ocean's Beaufort Sea, **Prudhoe Bay** is home to the North Slope oilfields and a permanent population of 47. More than 5,000 seasonal workers take part in drilling, pipeline operations, cargo transportation and a variety of support positions to supply about 20 percent of the United State's domestic oil supply. After a fascinating local tour, you'll depart on an afternoon jet flight to **Anchorage** where you'll transfer to your downtown hotel. Tonight, you'll be back to "civilization" as you spend the last night of your land tour in Alaska's largest and most cosmopolitan city.

Day 7 Anchorage/Seward

This morning depart by luxury motor coach skirting Cook Inlet and Turnagain Arm as you cross through the Chugach and Kenai Mountains on your way to Resurrection Bay and the port town of **Seward** where you can spend the afternoon exploring the downtown shops or take an optional tour. Lunch and dinner are served onboard. Say "good-bye" to your Tour Director and set sail.

Day 8 College Fjord cruising

While spending a relaxing morning at sea, enter **Prince William Sound** to the only place in Alaska that surrounds you on three sides with flowing rivers of ice, named after the leading Ivy League colleges.

Day 9 Glacier Bay National Park scenic cruising

This is Alaska's number-one glacier experience. Cruise from the Reid and Lamplugh glaciers to the mighty Johns Hopkins — surrounded by rugged peaks and sheltering a seal pupping ground. Linger for a full hour at the Grand Pacific and Margerie glaciers while a **National Park Service ranger** shares insights into the park's history and wildlife. And a **Huna Totem native speaker** will join the ship to impart the legend and lore of this sacred place.

Day 10 Haines/Skagway

This is the bald-eagle capital of Alaska. Tour the **Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve**, walk the historic fort or take a high-speed catamaran to nearby Skagway to ride the **White Pass & Yukon Route Railroad**. This frontier port is full of options.

Day 11 Juneau

Today, explore the lush Tongass National Forest or visit the rustic shops in town. History buffs can browse the Alaska State Museum. You'll have the day to explore **Mendenhall Glacier** or go whale watching, fishing or even dogsledding on a glacier!

Day 12 Ketchikan

Besides the main attractions — Creek Street, the Tongass Historical Museum, Totem Bight State Park and Saxman Village — there's one other thing we highly recommend you do. A flightseeing trip to breathtaking **Misty Fjords National Monument** is essential.
